Home Internet Safety



Filter

- The District filters material on the device that the District, at its sole discretion, deems to be inappropriate, including certain Internet sites.
- The District may grant requests to adjust filters or unblock sites/service for bona fide educational purposes. The student may make a request to their teacher who may request to have such filters or blocks adjusted.
- The presence of filters or blocks do not relieve the student and/or his/her parent(s)/guardian(s) of their responsibility to comply with requirements

Possible Uses for iPads at home....





General Guidelines

- The student's iPad should remain in their District-provided case at all times.

- A student's iPad should be used for academic purposes only.
- All Apps that are on the iPad are added and managed by the District. **You should NOT attempt to add your own Apps.**



Home Responsibilities

Student

Charging

- It is the expectation that the iPad comes to school at least 80% charged.

D34's Policy on iPad Transportation

- Before student leaves home/school → iPad's go into student's backpack and stays in the backpack until they arrived at their destination. Students are expected to keep the iPad in their backpack while in transit to home/school..



Home Responsibilities

Parent/Guardian

Internet Access

- Families provide home internet access.
 - If this is not available, please see handbook/website for internet resources; or
 - Request paper copy of internet resources from school office

Reasonable Care

- It is the responsibility of the student and his/her parent(s)/guardian(s) to exercise reasonable care over the device at all times. This includes, but is not limited to, keeping the device within the provided case at all times, securing the device in a safe location, and otherwise taking reasonable steps to protect the device from damage and theft.



Home Internet Safety

Supervision Outside of School

- The District's issuance of a device to the student **does not create any duty on the part of the District to provide supervision of the use of the device** or protection of the student regarding use of the device outside of school or outside of school hours. **It is the sole responsibility of the parent(s)/guardians(s) to supervise the student use of the device** when outside of school or outside of school hours.



Home Internet Safety

District Right to Monitor

- Users should have no expectation of privacy in materials, files, photos on any content created, received, sent, viewed, or otherwise accessed on the device, even if using a personal account (such as a personal email or social media account). This is because the student is using a district-owned device.



Registration Fee Increase

- Technology Fee \$75.
 - Due to the 1:1 Device Initiative occurring in our District, which includes students taking devices home in Grades 3-8.
- The Technology Fee is used for:
 - Cost of the devices themselves and the use of them (student 1:1 devices, computers in the schools, etc.)
 - Insurance on the devices should any need repairs
 - Upkeep/Maintenance of devices and district infrastructure
 - Digital resources



Insurance (effective April 1st)

In the event of a lost/stolen iPad, a deductible fee will be charged to the family at the following cost structure:

- Occurrence 1: \$50
- Occurrence 2: \$150
- Occurrence 3 (and subsequent): \$295 (full replacement cost)

In the event of a damaged iPad, a deductible fee will be charged to the family at the following cost structure:

- Occurrence 1: up to \$50 deductible towards the repair
- Occurrence 2: up to \$150 deductible towards the repair
- Occurrence 3 (and subsequent): Full Repair Cost or Device Replacement

In the event of a lost/stolen/damaged iPad accessory, fees will be charged to the family at the following cost structure:

- Replacement cost of Case: \$50
- Replacement cost of Screen protector: \$5
- Replacement cost of Charging Cable: \$19
- Replacement cost of Charging Brick: \$19

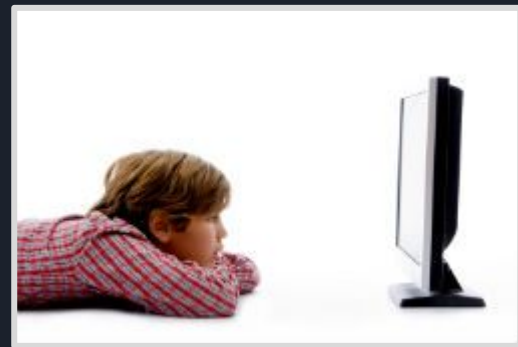


If the iPad is at 100%, it doesn't need to be connected to the charger
