Antioch CCSD 34 is a school district serving portions of the Antioch, Lake Villa, and Lindenhurst communities in Lake County, Illinois. The District is organized under the laws of the State of Illinois for the purpose of providing its residents with schools for grades Pre-K-8 for the education of all eligible persons in the District.

The District operates the following schools:

- Mary Kay McNeill Early Learning Center, for Pre-K, located at 817 Main Street, Antioch
- Antioch Upper Grade School, for grades 6-8, located at 800 Highview Drive, Antioch
- Hillcrest Elementary School, for grades K-5, located at 433 Depot Street, Antioch
- Oakland Elementary School, for grades K-5, located at 818 E. Grass Lake Rd., Lake Villa
- W.C. Petty Elementary School, for grades K-5, located at 850 Highview Drive, Antioch
